

Keeping Your Head Above the Grass: Managing Lawns in the West

The challenge with our specific climate is that grass never truly stops growing, even in the shoulder seasons. When you combine high humidity with temperatures that rarely drop below freezing, you have a recipe for constant vertical growth. If the lawn is left uncut for too long, the lower sections of the grass stems are deprived of light and turn yellow. When you finally do get a chance to mow, you end up cutting into this yellow, woody material. This "scalping" shocks the plant, leaving the lawn looking pale and sickly for weeks. It also weakens the root system, making the turf more susceptible to the encroachment of moss, which is the opportunist of the Irish garden.

Consistency is the only real defence. By maintaining a regular cutting schedule, you force the grass to adapt. Instead of growing tall to compete for light, it begins to grow laterally, thickening up at the base. This creates a dense, carpet-like sward that is naturally resistant to weeds and moss. However, achieving this consistency with a domestic mower is easier said than done. Wet grass is heavy and sticky. It clogs chutes, strains engines, and leaves unsightly clumps of mulch on the lawn that can rot the grass underneath.

This airflow is vital for drying out the soil surface between showers, reducing the conditions that favour fungal diseases.
